SECTION VIII - TRAPPING OR SNARING FURBEARING ANIMALS

SUBDIVISION 9. GENERAL TRAPPING RESTRICTIONS

(J) ~~OTTER, BOBCAT, FISHER, AND MARTEN~~

~~The 1854 TREATY AUTHORITY shall issue carcass tags to band members which shall be affixed at the point of kill to each otter, bobcat, fisher and marten taken. The 1854 Treaty Authority will keep a record of the number of each carcass tag issued; together with the name, address, and phone number of the member to whom issued. **All unused carcass tags must be returned to the 1854 Treaty Authority Biological Services Division or an 1854 Conservation Officer by the return date provided on the tag receipt form signed by the band member upon receipt of tags.** Failure to do so is a violation.~~

(N) POSSESSION OF GREEN SKINS

- (1) Band members may possess the green skin of a furbearing animal for up to ten (10) days after the close of the open season for that animal.
- (2) Band members may possess the green skin of a furbearing animal after the tenth (10) day following the close of an open season for the animal provided:
 - a. ~~the band member has tagged the animal and presented it to an 1854 Treaty Authority registration station within ten (10) days of the close of the open season for the animal; or~~
 - b. ~~the band member has been issued a permit for the retention of the animal specifying the band member's name, the species of the animal and the number of the tag affixed to the animal.~~

The animal has been properly registered and a registration tag is affixed to the animal.
- (3) No band member may affix his/her tag to an animal trapped by another.
