The 1854 Treaty Authority is hosting a week-long tribal summer youth camp, July 30<sup>th</sup> through August 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2018. *Nenda – Gikendan Noopiming gaye Nibiing* is designed to provide Native American students an opportunity to gain hands-on experience in the field of natural resource management, and encourage them to pursue related college majors and careers. At this **FREE** camp, participants will spend time in classroom sessions, field trips, recreational events, and work alongside professionals in fish and game monitoring and survey activities.

Incoming 10-12th grade, college bound students affiliated with a tribe in Minnesota, Michigan and/or Wisconsin, are welcome to apply. Parents/guardians are responsible for selected participants’ transportation to and from the 1854 Treaty Authority Office in Duluth, Minnesota on travel days: Monday July 30th and Friday August 3rd, 2018.
